**Marlborough Sports Garden** is a hub for affordable, accessible sport minutes from busy Borough High Street. Run by environmental and volunteering charity **Bankside Open Spaces Trust**, the garden is just one of 16 public open spaces we manage in an area where **91% of homes are flats, with no private gardens**. This lack of space has a real impact on health and wellbeing locally – **Southwark has the highest rate of childhood obesity at Year 6 of any local authority in England**.

Gifted to the community in 1921 by the Duchess of Marlborough, the sports garden attracts thousands for sport and play each year. We know it has the potential to do so much more. We have ambitious plans to reach thousands more people, particularly those excluded from sport, through sustainable redevelopment. This includes indoor facilities, income generating activities and site-wide greening. We want to be part of a brighter future for young Londoners.

## **Marlborough Sports Garden - the facts**

- 1 A free public space, open 7 days a week, with 12 schools within walking distance.

## **Marlborough Sports Garden: the plans**

Working with award-winning architects Cullinan Studio, we've drawn up a £5m+ plan to upgrade existing facilities and boost the site's reach and income through a new sustainably built and run building. We'll play an even greater role in tackling inactivity and obesity locally by growing visitor numbers to 75,000 and increasing the number of people taking part in activities by at least 50%. Our build is due to start August 2025, the garden reopens August 2026.
